
The Alcona County Road Commission was established in 1919 and has been at the same location since.

Funding for roads comes from motor fuel taxes and the vehicle registration fee collected in Michigan. The funding is distributed among the 83 county road authorities through the Michigan Transportation Fund based on a formula that considers miles of road and population .

A three-member elected Board makes policy and generally oversees the operation of the Alcona County Road Commission. Board members serve a six-year term and are elected at large.

Road Commission meetings are held on the second and fourth Wednesday each month at 4:00 p.m. at the office. Meetings are open to the public.

Driveways

I want to install a driveway

Driveways are permitted within the road right of way to allow access to properties along the roadway.

Because a driveway has a big impact on the ditch, drainage, road edge, and



traffic patterns, a permit is required to ensure proper installation.

If you wish to construct a new driveway, or re-

use an existing one,

the first step is to

contact the Road

Commission. A per-

mit application will

be provided and

once submitted, a

road commission

representative will inspect the site,

An approved copy of the permit will

be returned to the applicant and will

include all the specifications for instal-

lation.

Whether you as the property owner choose to install the driveway, or

you opt to hire the work done, the

driveway must be constructed according to the instructions outlined on the permit.

When a culvert is required, the minimum size allowed is 15"X24'. The culvert must be new and it is recommended that it be made of re-corrugated steel. Alternatives may be allowed, but such approval is dependent upon the location and the intended use of the driveway.

Driveways shall be installed in a manner that does not necessitate added elements such as head walls, fences, or other structures that become roadside obstacles.

Maintenance and repair of a driveway are the responsibility of the property owner.

Before you begin, **contact MISS DIG at 800 482 7171** to locate and mark any buried facilities such as gas, electric, and communication lines that may be in the right of way.

The Road Commission's goal, is to preserve, protect, and keep the right of way safe.

Please contact us before starting any other activities within the road right of way.
